Total Reported Abortions **48,149**

132 children are aborted every day in Florida, 5 every hour, and 1 every 11 minutes.

Florida Critical Data Correlation: The "Pill Confusion"

There is a notable data overlap in the 2025 reports between
Emergency Contraception and Medication Abortion:

- **The Misconception:** Public health surveys in Florida in 2025 found that nearly **30% of residents** confuse the morning-after pill (EC) with the abortion pill (Mifepristone).
- **The Shield Law Factor:** While ITOP reports show *in-state* clinical abortions are down, they do not track "self-managed" abortions via pills mailed from out-of-state "shield law" providers.
- **The Impact:** Some of the "decline" in ITOP reports is likely a shift from in-clinic procedures to out-of-state telehealth medication, which is often mistakenly categorized or discussed alongside emergency contraception in public discourse.

The Florida Agency for Health Care Administration reports that the abortions took place in Florida during 2023-2025. This number includes abortions performed on out-of-state residents but does not include abortions performed on Florida residents in other states.

Bottom Line: In Florida, the morning-after pill is acting as the "first line of defense." The 20,000-case drop in the 2025 ITOP report is a combination of people successfully using EC to prevent pregnancy, people traveling out of state, and people using telehealth services that bypass state reporting.
